Enrollment 2024

It's always amazing to feel the buzz of excitement around priority enrollment each fall. The previous summer is not far behind us, and already returning camper families are reaching out to secure their spot for the next summer and new families are calling and emailing with questions about when to sign up. It is an incredibly rewarding time to see all of these familiar names streaming in, and to know so many are already counting the days until next summer. We love to see all of the new siblings applying at this time also. For the youngest age groups where we knew we would have the space, we were able to fit these new siblings in right away. For new siblings in the older age groups that can fill up during priority enrollment, we had to wait until right after priority enrollment closed before enrolling them just to be sure all of those wishing to return have secured their spot. We were thrilled to accommodate all of the new siblings who applied in these early months.

The processing of new camper family applications began on November 1st and there were over 150 applications pending for processing at that time. Some of these names we recognized as applicants who had been waitlisted the year prior. We were determined to get these campers enrolled this year, and we had great success there! Many of these other new applicants signed up after hearing stories about Skylake from their friends who attended the prior summer. We could see that many of the new applicants had submitted an inquiry on our website earlier in the year and had been planning ahead for the summer of 2024 many months prior. We recognize this effort, and we look do our best to fit in these families in.

Applying in this initial enrollment period is the best way to get on our radar and secure a spot, even if it means starting out on a waitlist. We did start a few waitlists early in November in some of our age groups and sessions that have the highest demand. We still had space available in some age groups and sessions after the initial rush of new camper applications which was actually a relief to us. We understand that not all parents are aware that many camps start enrolling this early. We hear from so many families later in the year who just learned about Skylake through friends or have found us on the internet and their child has read every page and desperately wants to come. While it might make us feel good, and to know that we are doing a great job by having long waitlists, it is also really hard. We just want to be able to say yes to everyone who applies so their child can experience the joy and magic of summer camp. We work diligently throughout the year to manage our waitlists and fill spots when cancellations come in.

For those who find themselves on a waitlist at this time, it can be hard for us to make predictions, however we do see trends. We tend to see clusters of cancellations around the new year, and again before March 15th, and then a few more just before summer. We ask families who are currently on wait lists to be patient. If a spot opens up we will reach out to offer the spot, and we will make sure that we hear back from you before moving to the next camper on the list. We welcome you to check in for updates, and if your plans have changed and you no longer need to remain on our waitlists, it is helpful to us and others if you could please let us know.

The history of Skylake and the Howe Family are critical to understanding what Skylake is today. The roots of Skylake were planted long ago by John Howe, and his mom and dad Wendell and Ruth. John passed away in November and he will be missed.

Skylake summer camp was launched during the war years of WWII. Originally located at Lake Tahoe, the campers came by train and took advantage of available food rations to feed the campers. Wendell and Ruth were school teachers from the San Joaquin Valley who had a dream. Starting small, originally boys only, the camp grew with its most significant growth coming after the move to Bass Lake and the camp being taken over by their son John Howe.

The Howe family operated Skylake for 50 years before selling the camp to Jeff Portnoy and his partner Chuck Gould. The Portnoy and Gould children had all been Skylake campers as children. Jeff directed the camp for 25 years before his daughters Adrienne and Jessica assumed the day-to-day responsibilities. The goal is for the Portnoys to match the 50 years of the Howe family.

In 1995 when I assumed the Directorship at Skylake, John remained with me the first summer to insure we transitioned easily. I had a lot to learn and John had a lot to teach. Camp life was a lot simpler in those days, as this was even before we had a website or an email address. There was no Facebook, and the Apple iPhone was 12 years away from being released.

In 50 years, a camp is capable of developing some beautiful traditions, and Skylake was no exception. Staff serenade on closing nights, "Shasta Call" when the soda of choice was Shasta, CILT night, Length of the Lake Swim, and so many more. The strength of the Skylake alumni groups on Facebook attests to how Skylake became a part of so many young peoples' lives.

Skylake remains today much as John Howe left it in 1995. We strive to retain the simpler lifestyle that was a hallmark of the early summer camps. Today, probably even more than in those early days, kids still really need a place to slow down and just be kids.

John, thank you for being my mentor and confidant for these last 28 years, I will miss you.

The First of 4th Generation Skylakers!

As Skylake heads towards its 80th summer in 2024, many emotions and thoughts of the smiling faces, laughter and friendships made over the past 8 decades come to mind. With the passing of former owner John T. Howe, the Portnoy family has been in touch with many families from the past, many of whom attended camp with Adrienne and Jessica in their younger years and some who attended Skylake before they were born! Ann Mothershead Bjorklund is one such camper. Ann is a bit of Skylake legend as she now has great grandchildren attending Skylake today!

Ann started going to Skylake the summer of 1955 when Skylake was still at its Lake Tahoe location and only in the second summer that it had started to be a coed summer camp. This is the same summer that Disneyland opened its gates to the public and when Dwight D. Eisenhower was President. Ann was a camper for 8 summers, half of her time as a 4 week camper and half as an 8 week camper! Ann's older brother Lee started back in 1949 when Skylake was only 4 years old and continued to attend for 9 years, always for 8 weeks, and as a counselor during the latter years. Ann is part of the fabric of Skylake and now has great grandchildren attending Skylake today. Over the course of the years, between Ann and her husband Pete, they've had 5 children at camp, 15 grandchildren, and 4 great grandchildren attend Skylake. Ann estimates around 100 Skylake summers when you add up her years and all of the offspring. Four generations enjoying the magic of Skylake is something to celebrate! In Ann's words, "Skylake magic is a real thing."

Off Season Camp Maintenance & Improvements Continue...

The intense summer sun and in some years the extreme winter conditions take a toll on Skylake's facilities. Not to mention the more than 1,000 of us (campers, staff, and family camp guests) who use the camp's facilities each season. We take pride in keeping up on annual maintenance and repairs, as well as special projects and other improvements along the way.

Many of our projects go under the radar and unseen, while others are quickly visible. Many campers recognized and appreciated the new bunks built in some of the cabins this past year, and we have now completed this project on the remainder of the cabins. Everyone will now get to enjoy the additional head room! The updates we did last season on the interior of the cabins to sand and remove names and graffiti was met with mixed emotions as we expected, but overall, the brighter and cleaner spaces were appreciated as we hoped. We will continue to emphasize the no graffiti policy at each session's opening rules campfire and ask all of our campers from both Children's Camp and Family Camp to help us take good care of camp, and keeping our cabins looking great and free of graffiti. Continual work of stripping and staining the exterior of the cabins continues on this winter. This is a project that always improves the appearance of camp and there were just a few remaining this year that need to be brought up to our standards.

Other big projects taken on this fall were more enhancements to the Health Hut! The Health Hut has consisted of a front reception/treatment room, two camper "dorm rooms" with bunk beds, a Nurse's bedroom and one full bathroom. The nurse who sleeps in the Health Hut had no choice but to share their bathroom with sick campers and staff. This always bothered us and never felt fair, so we finally came up with a solution. Just like the HGTV experts, we got creative by repurposing two storage closets, one accessed from inside for medical supplies and the other from the outside where housekeeping supplies were stored. The spaces were combined, a window installed and the space is now a beautiful half bathroom available for Health Hut visitors, leaving the nurse to have a private bathroom. The building also received brand new windows, new siding and an extended front deck! An additional air conditioning unit was installed in one of the dorm rooms to add more cold air flow circulation into the building. While we know it is no fun to be sick at camp, we want to make campers as comfortable as possible if they do become ill and need to spend time in the Health Hut.

We are excited about the big spring project on the horizon to completely resurface our tennis courts! This has been a project that we have wanted to do for several years now, some might say we really needed to do, and unfortunately other priorities and capital improvements had shoved it to the side. The roots had taken over and the cracks had become really bad, we know. After working through several different options and speaking with a few different companies, we are thrilled to finally get this project going once the winter weather is behind us. And we know we are in good hands by signing on with a company who has resurfaced courts for a fellow WAIC camp, Carmel Valley Tennis Camp. All of you tennis, pickleball and "wall ball" players out there should be very pleased!



Staffing Update 2024

We are deep into the interview and hiring process for the summer ahead and are proud to report that we've hired more than 40% of our counselors. We started our interview process earlier this season and are getting some great applicants who are already excited for the experience. Of the staff hired to date, almost half of this group are former campers! Camp thrives having a portion of our staff who were former Skylake campers. We have watched them grow up or at least experienced some time with them during their childhood, and now they will return as young adults! Working with this group feels like a full circle as we explain to them the job of a counselor is one of the most important and meaningful positions a young person can hold. We know it is the most important position to our campers, and for this reason we interview for the best people we can find to fill these important roles at camp.

Working at Skylake, whether as a counselor or to a larger degree on our Admin Leadership team, is not just fun; it is resume building, meaningful and full of new social connection opportunities. Often these new friendships expand a young person's network across the globe! Indeed recently listed the top 12 career skills that are desired in today's job market. These included; decision making, multi-tasking, creative problem solving, collaboration, communication, professionalism, integrity, management, initiative, empathy, leadership and teamwork. These sure sound like the skills of a seasoned summer camp professional! These are the very skills we focus on and grow with our Skylake Staff every summer. Not all of these skills come automatically for all people, and we work daily with our staff at all levels to build these skills which greatly benefits them and our campers.

Professional Development & Conference Season



As Camp Directors, the “off season” is a great time to reflect on the past summer, plan for the next summer, and to grow our knowledge in this dynamic and changing world. It is of huge importance to us to continuously strive to be better and provide the best experience possible for families of today. One of our favorite conferences to attend is the Annual WAIC Conference (Western Association of Independent Camps). This year’s conference was held in Monterey Bay the week following Thanksgiving. The conference provides educational workshops, general sessions, an annual meeting of members, a vendor tradeshow and most valuable in so many ways are the networking opportunities. Summer camps find ourselves in a unique, small and very sharing industry. We all grow from these annual gatherings, sharing positive stories as well as business challenges and how we work through them. We also hear stories of our Skylake campers attending other WAIC member camps too! It is an environment of building each other up so that we are stronger together. These other camp directors have become our friends and we leave each other after the week feeling our cup is more full, and our to do list just a little bit longer. Our common goal of providing meaningful experiences for our campers and staff is an incredible one to share.

In early October we also attended the “CampMinder Camp” conference in Boulder, Colorado. This bi-annual conference is attended by camps from across the country who utilize the CampMinder enrollment system. These conferences provide time for CampMinder to share advancements in functionality, the road map to where they are looking to go, and a time for camps to have a seat at the table to talk about what works well and what more we would like to see out of the system. This innovative business has grown leaps and bounds since we started with them in 2013, and we appreciate these opportunities to talk tech and camp with them!

Also in October, Skylake took part in a 3 Day virtual Staffing Summit sponsored by the ACA (American Camp Association). The conference was based on what today’s counselor aged applicants and employees want in a position, what they need in a position, and what they can gain from a meaningful summer as camp counselor. Gen Z is here! They’ve grown up during an interesting time in our history, have had to deal with the social disruption of COVID, and are more socially aware than any other generation. Learning about their needs and wants helps us provide a better work experience and working relationship.

Another conference on the horizon is ACA’s Spring Leadership Conference. This is a wonderful conference where program ideas and staff training concepts are discussed and learned through workshops and general sessions.

We love continuing our education and bringing our lessons learned back to camp every summer!

Take Advantage of the **CAMPANION** Mobile App

It has been three years now since Skylake upgraded our CampMinder system to include the **Campanion app** for our families. Initially offered as a camper photo tagging system for parents to view daily photos on an app, it has now grown to include other features such as completing forms and signing up again for camp right from the app. When CampMinder first rolled out this new offering, we had many internal conversations about how it might change camp and some of the rewarding parts of the camp experience, such as building independence both for the child and also for the parent to learn and grow from healthy separation and not seeing each and every experience and achievement. There's something special when a child does something without a camera there to catch the moment. They realize they did something for themselves and for the pure joy it brought them.

Prior to Campanion, Skylake posted daily photos and a Director's newsletter each day on the Camp in Touch site, accessed only by computer. Our philosophy of taking and sharing photos has been to share just enough, but not all of the camper's experience, as to give the child their independence and a healthy amount of separation. We would take about 100 photos each day in camp with the goal of capturing as many campers as possible, and these are often candid action shots and not posed. We fully understand that parents are starved for information about their child when they are away at camp, and that seeing a photo provides reassurance they are doing well and that they are happy. We have now fully embraced Campanion and see that the addition of the app has improved the experience for busy parents. We take roughly the same volume of photos with Campanion and now the app tags your child for you and will even send a notification to your phone as soon as we upload their photo if you have your notifications settings on for Campanion. The days of scrolling through 100 photos to hopefully find one of your child each day are gone. The experience is far superior and we've kept our philosophy the same. *While you may not see photos of your camper each and every day they are in camp, when they do show up in photos, they are now that much easier to view and then download to your phone for free.*



In order to see the most value in the app, we ask that families download the app and sign in well before camp. Additionally, the Camper Forms that we will release in the spring can all be submitted easier than ever before through the app! We will announce all required Health and Travel forms in an email in the spring to be completed through the app or on the computer if you prefer through your existing Camp in Touch online account.

Each parent on the camper account has access to download this app and then log in with their own Camp in Touch log in. This is the very same email and password you used to sign up for camp. **And for the parent who didn't submit the application and haven't logged into Camp in Touch before, we can send you a link to set up your own password. See the bullet point on #2 below.**

To get started with Campanion, follow these three simple steps:

1. Download the Campanion app available on iOS and Android to your phone today from the App store on your iPhone, or Play Store from your Android.
2. **Find the app on your phone and log in** to the app using your Camper Account login email and password (the same one you use for Camp in Touch). **Parents should each download the app and use their own email to log in. We do not recommend sharing the same log in.** If one parent ever changes a password after forgetting it for example, it would then lock the other parent out from logging in, so we really advise each parent log in as themselves. **The app is free for each parent in both the primary and alternate household.**
 - **For parents who have not used Camp In Touch** (i.e. you are not the parent filling out the forms and application each year) and don't know what your password is, we can email you a password reset link to set up a password with the log in email we have on account for you. If you receive emails from us, we have a log in email for you, and you just need to set up a password. Give us a call or email us at registration@skylake.com if that's the case and we can get that email right off to you.
3. Once the app is downloaded on your phone, you will be prompted to **Upload** a reference photo of your child. Once one parent takes or uploads the camper reference photo, it is set up on all parent devices. Only one parent needs to do this step. **A new training photo is required annually for returning campers, and CampMinder clears the old photos out each spring.**

This information will all be provided again to you in the 2024 Parent Handbook mailed to all enrolled families in the spring. If you have any questions at all, please give us a call and we would be happy to help!
